Frequently Asked Questions

Here's some important info about the Repeat (Autumn) exams and assessments for 2024/25. It includes key details, so please take a few minutes to read it all carefully.

Make sure you can log in to your student email. If needed, reset your password ahead of time so you don't miss any important updates.

 When Are the Results Issued?	<p>Your results will be available online on or before 2:00 pm on Friday 12 September 2025.</p> <p>If there's a slight delay, thanks for your patience — we'll get them to you as soon as possible!</p>
 How Do I Access My Results?	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1 Go to the Student Self Service page.2 Log in using your MS 365 account details<ul style="list-style-type: none">– Forgot your password? Email support@iadt.ie for help3 Scroll down to “Final Grades – Results” and click the link4 On the next page, choose your year of study — your results will then be shown <p>What the result codes mean:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">– JAN = Semester 1 results– SUM = Semester 2 results– AUT = Repeat Exam Session results <p>If you run into any tech issues, just email support@iadt.ie with your name, student number, and a short description of the problem</p>
 What Do My Grades Mean?	<p> Passed</p> <p>You've passed if you don't have any of these grades - F, NP, I, IA, IS, W, FL, or D.</p> <p>Your final award classification (like a 1st or 2:1) will be calculated once you've completed your full programme. This will only show if you're finishing your course in this exam session.</p> <p> Not Passed</p> <p>If you have any of these grades: F, NP, I, IA, IS, W, FL, or D, you haven't passed yet. You'll receive an email to your student account with instructions on what happens next, based on the Semester 2 Exam Board's decisions.</p> <p> EX Grades or Exemptions Granted</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">– EX means you've passed that module, so no need to repeat it– Exemptions Granted means you're exempt from that specific module, but you might still need to repeat other modules based on your overall results

<p> How Will I Know if I Need to Repeat?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you need to repeat a module or have deferred modules, you'll get an email titled "Decision of the Repeat (Autumn) Exam Board" sent to your student email – This email will explain the Exam Board's decision regarding your repeat process – Make sure you check your student email regularly so you don't miss any important updates
<p> How Do I Repeat?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you fail any module in Semester 1 or 2, you might not be able to progress to the next year of your programme unless you've completed all the required credits — unless there are exceptional circumstances. These will be reviewed and decided by the Exam Board during the Autumn Exam Board meeting on a case-by-case basis – If you need to repeat a module, Academic + Student Affairs will automatically register you for it, so you don't need to do anything – The repeat process (whether it's a project, exam, or repeat with attendance the following year) will be decided by the Exam Board based on your specific situation.
<p> How Much Does It Cost to Repeat?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you're repeating a project or exam, the cost is €25 per module. This fee will be added to your account when you're registered for the repeat. – If you need to repeat with attendance, the cost depends on how many credits you need to repeat <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The fee for 2025/26 is €3,819 for all Level 7 + 8 programmes • To calculate the cost: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Divide €3,819 by 60 (the total number of credits in a full year) ○ Multiply by the number of credits you need to repeat <p><i>Example:</i></p> <p>If you need to repeat 20 credits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ $€3,819 \div 60 = €63.65$ per credit ○ $€63.65 \times 20 \text{ credits} = €1,273$
<p> Appealing Your Semester 2 Exam Results</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you want to appeal your results, the deadline is Thursday 18 September 2025, by 4:00 pm. Please make sure to submit your appeal on time, as late appeals won't be processed – For appeal instructions and forms, visit this here

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To submit your appeal, email your appeal along with any supporting documents and the appeal fee (paid through this payment link) to appeals@iadt.ie by 4:00 pm on or before Thursday 18 September 2025
<p> What Happens if You Have Outstanding Fees?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If you have outstanding fees, you'll be able to access your grades for one week only. After that, a hold will be placed on your account, blocking access to your grades and transcripts - Repeat students with outstanding fees will not be registered for repeats, won't be invited to register, and won't be able to attend classes the following year - Final-year students who've passed but still owe fees will not be invited to the Conferring ceremony until all fees are paid - Transcripts and parchments won't be issued until your fees are fully settled - You can pay your fees easily through this payment link <p>For any fee-related queries, email feesgrants@iadt.ie.</p>
<p> What if I Have Deferred a Module(s)?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If you've received an I grade for any modules, you'll be automatically registered for the deferred modules - For I grades, you'll be registered for the module in the following year
<p> What Does It Mean If I've Received a Confirmation Letter?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A Confirmation Letter means you've failed a significant portion of your year, and the Exam Board or Faculty needs to know whether you plan to continue your studies at IADT - Make sure to respond by the deadline to confirm your decision. - If you decide to return, you may need to repeat failed modules (either as projects or with attendance in 2025/26). Your department head will give you all the details about your repeat process.
<p> Autumn Conferring 2025</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Autumn Conferring will take place on Friday, 31 October 2025. Details will be sent to all relevant students by mid- to late-September - If you have outstanding fees, you won't be allowed to attend the Conferring or receive your transcript or parchment until all fees are paid - Please note, fees won't be accepted at the event itself
