



Welcome to the IADT First Year Focus Guide!



We are really looking forward to welcoming students to IADT. This guide contains some useful information to help you settle in and find your feet at IADT.

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

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WELCOME



IMPORTANT INFORMATION



You've accepted your offer of a place on an IADT programme — what's next?

We will contact you at the email address that you supplied to the CAO. Check that email address for your 'Welcome to IADT' communication from IADT. This email will provide you with a link to our landing page for new students, which contains lots of information about becoming an IADT student, including how to register. Make sure to check your spam/junk folder in case our welcome email goes there. The Welcome to IADT email will prompt you to:

- Register for your programme
- Set up your IADT email
- Collect your student card
- Pay your fees

Keep an eye on your email, the landing page and on the IADT website for important updates and next steps over the coming weeks.

INDUCTION

Induction is **compulsory** for all incoming IADT Students and will consist of the following:

- Making introductions and getting to know classmates and FYF leaders
- Familiarising yourself with online resources such as The Hub, Blackboard, registration etc.
- Getting to know the campus through tours
- Finding out more information about campus services available to you
- Learning more about IADT Clubs & Societies
- Meeting members of IADTSU and student support staff such as the Student Experience Team
- Meeting with lecturers and instructors and learning how to contact them
- Learning IADT Rules and Regulations
- Receiving your student card and information regarding Fees, Grants etc.

REGISTRATION

All eligible undergraduate students will receive a 'Welcome to IADT' email with a link to The Hub, your central platform for all aspects of college life, including registration, fees, and support services. The email will be sent to the email address you supplied to the CAO. There is a 'Registration' link on The Hub, prompting you to register for your programme. It is best to complete registration on a PC or laptop, as the process is not mobile phone friendly.

As part of registration, you will complete a detailed form which will ask you to review and add contact information.

If you have previously attended a higher education institution, you will be asked to state this and provide certain documents as part of registration.


We request that students register promptly upon receipt of your invitation to register email. NB: If you do not register for your programme promptly, you may lose your place. Access to IADT's learning platforms, the library and other services are dependent on you completing the registration process.

You will be 'Conditionally Registered' until your fees have been paid in full. Once your fees have been paid in full you will be 'Registered'.

If you have any queries regarding registration, please email registration@iadt.ie. Registration is required for all students for each year of study at IADT.

Check your IADT email address

Please make sure you can access your IADT student email. Official communication from the institute will be sent to your student email address.



STUDENT CARDS

Your student card is an official form of identification that confirms you are an IADT student. Only students who have fully completed the registration process are eligible to receive a student card.

Your card will be generated and printed on your induction day, once registration is complete. Assistance will be available on the day if you need help completing the registration form.

The student card is valid for the duration of your programme. If you withdraw from your programme, you must return your student card.

If you lose your card, you can order a replacement online via the Replacement Card Store. The current cost of a replacement card is €10.

Please carry your student card with you at all times while on campus. You must present it upon request to IADT staff or any authorised personnel.

STUDENT CONTRIBUTION FEE

An annual Student Contribution Fee is payable by all students. This amount, currently €3,000 for undergraduate programmes, is subject to change from year to year. The Student Contribution Fee includes an examination fee and is payable for each year of study. 50% of your overall student contribution fee must be paid by 30 September and the balance must be paid by 31 January.

How do I pay my fees?

Students can pay Student Contribution Fees, by logging onto IADT's online ePayment service which you can access on <https://epay.iadt.ie/invoice>. You will require your IADT Student ID number and date of birth, and a valid credit or debit card to access this service.

Students with outstanding fees will not be permitted to progress to the next stage of their programme, or to graduate. You must return materials on loan to the Library and pay any outstanding fines in order to progress or to graduate.

The Fees team will monitor registration and fee payment and will prompt students to pay their fees in a timely manner to ensure students are fully registered for their programme.

Grants

All grants are administered by Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI). See www.susi.ie or www.studentfinance.ie for information. Please note that decisions regarding eligibility are made by SUSI and not IADT. Students who receive a grant may have this contribution partially or fully covered depending on the level and type of grant received. ACADEMIC + STUDENT AFFAIRS OFFICE

The Academic + Student Affairs Team provides administrative support for a wide range of activities including admissions, registration, examinations, grants and fees.

The office is located in the **Atrium Building, Room A027** and is normally open to students from 9am to 5pm, Mon - Fri. STUDENT SERVICES




IADT offer a wide range of fully inclusive support services for new and returning students.




INFORMATION POINT


IADT Library is located on two floors in the Atrium building. Opening hours and access to the online library services are available on the [Library website](#). Our online library is available 24/7; you can access a range of supports and resources that include eBooks, online journals, databases, and a streaming service.

Library staff can help you with a whole range of things like searching for information, finding items on your reading list, referencing, and avoiding plagiarism. The whole range of supports and information available for students is on our [website](#), including a guide for each subject area signposting key library resources and useful tips.

While you are in the Library you can use any of our PCs or MACs in the tech hub or use your library card to borrow a laptop or MacBook to use anywhere in the Library or bring your own device and connect to IADT's wireless network.

Everyone is welcome to come to the Library to study quietly, meet with friends, borrow books and watch DVDs. Level 1 is a collaborative study space and Level 2 is a designated quiet study space. Use the self-issue station to borrow books and DVDs, quickly, easily and safely.






IADT CLUBS AND SOCIETIES



IADT Students' Union represents and supports all students. It's run by students with elected representatives from each class on Union Council. Its functions include representing the student body at an academic level, offering advice on welfare, finances and education. IADTSU organises awareness campaigns, charity, entertainment and social events. It also facilitates the running of clubs and societies on campus.

The main roles of the IADT Students' Union are:

- Representing the interests and furthers the rights of its membership as a whole and individually. This takes the form of representation on committees that look at everything from teaching and learning to IADT's governing body, as well as representing individuals in disciplinary or appeals procedures.
- Offering advice on welfare and education.
- Organising awareness campaigns, charity, entertainment and social events throughout the year such as concerts, club nights, drag shows, quizzes, themed weeks such as RAG Week, SHAG Week, Welfare Week and much more.
- Managing The Chapel in the Quadrangle building as a recreational and event space for students.
- Facilitating clubs and societies, ensuring students' right to form or join a group to satisfy cultural, social, sporting and intellectual needs.



Getting involved in the SU is a great way to get to know people. Autonomous from IADT, the SU is affiliated with the Union of Students in Ireland (USI).

The President, the Vice-President for Education and the Vice-President for Welfare & Equality are full-time sabbatical members who are elected to work for the SU as a full-time job for one year. Clubs and Societies Officer, Entertainments Officer, Mature Students' Officer and LGBTQ+ Rights Officer are part-time roles. Disability Rights and Oifigeach na Gaeilge are also Part-Time officer roles.


